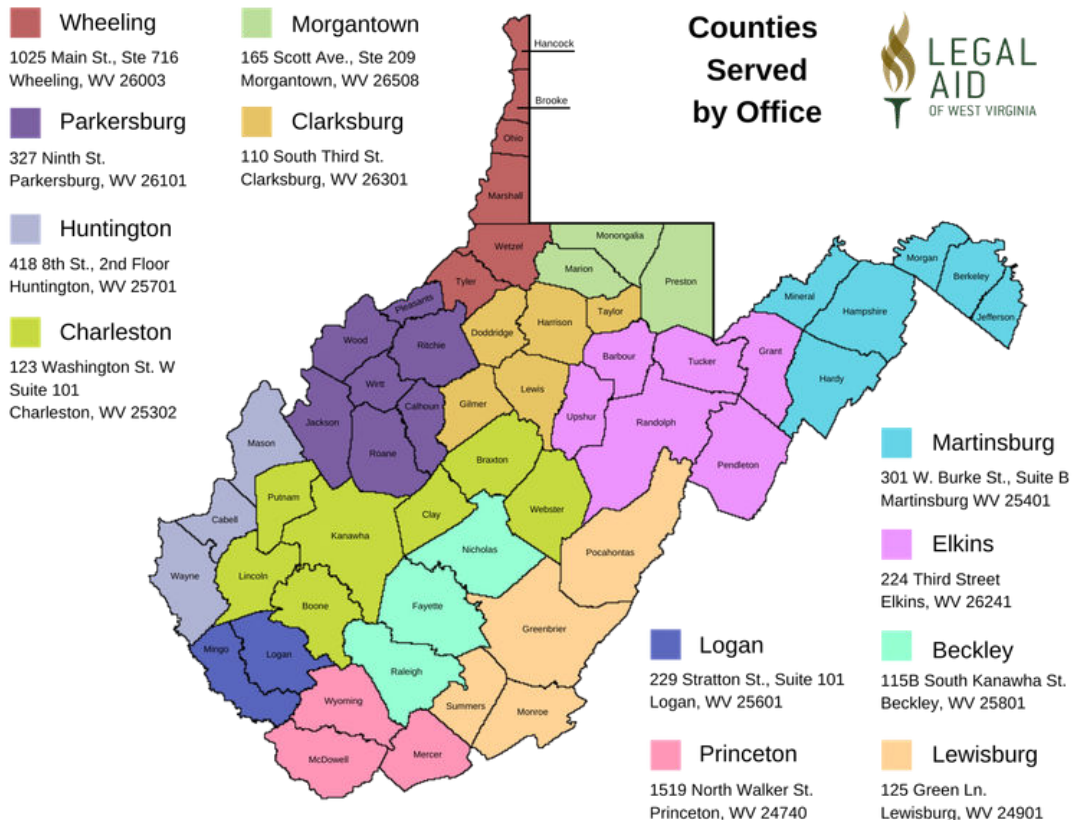


Our Vision

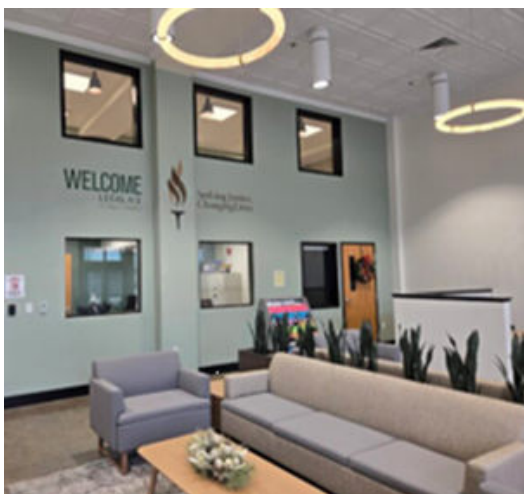
Adrienne's leadership shaped Legal Aid for nearly three decades. Her vision and dedication expanded services, strengthened partnerships, and ensured that thousands of West Virginians received life-changing legal help. One of her final achievements was laying the groundwork for our Statewide Headquarters to move into a new home in a historic building on Charleston's West Side. This will benefit the organization for generations. This move, described in more detail in this report, represents both a continuation of Adrienne's legacy and a new chapter for our organization.

Like many nonprofits across the country, Legal Aid faced uncertainties this past year, requiring thoughtful and difficult decisions, including scaling back some programs and services due to funding decreases. Yet even amid these challenges, our commitment to fairness, safety, and access to justice has never wavered.

We are also looking ahead with excitement. We are launching our Voices for Kids Project, a new initiative that will provide guardian ad litem services to children in abuse and neglect proceedings. The project will also offer preventative legal services designed to stabilize at-risk families before crises deepen. This work strikes at the heart of why Legal Aid exists: to protect the vulnerable, uphold fairness, and support stronger, safer communities.

In this report, you will find information on the thousands of clients we served across our many areas of civil legal assistance, Behavioral Health Advocacy, and Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program. These numbers represent real people, real struggles, and real progress made possible only through the collective effort of many.

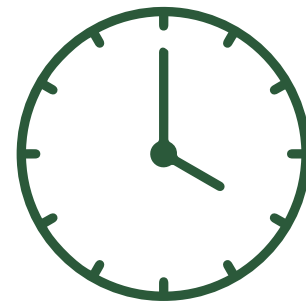
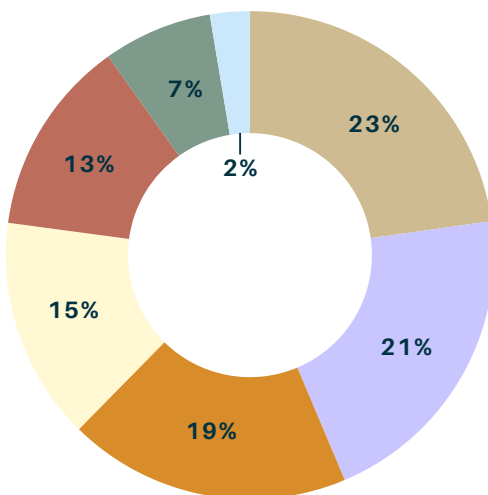

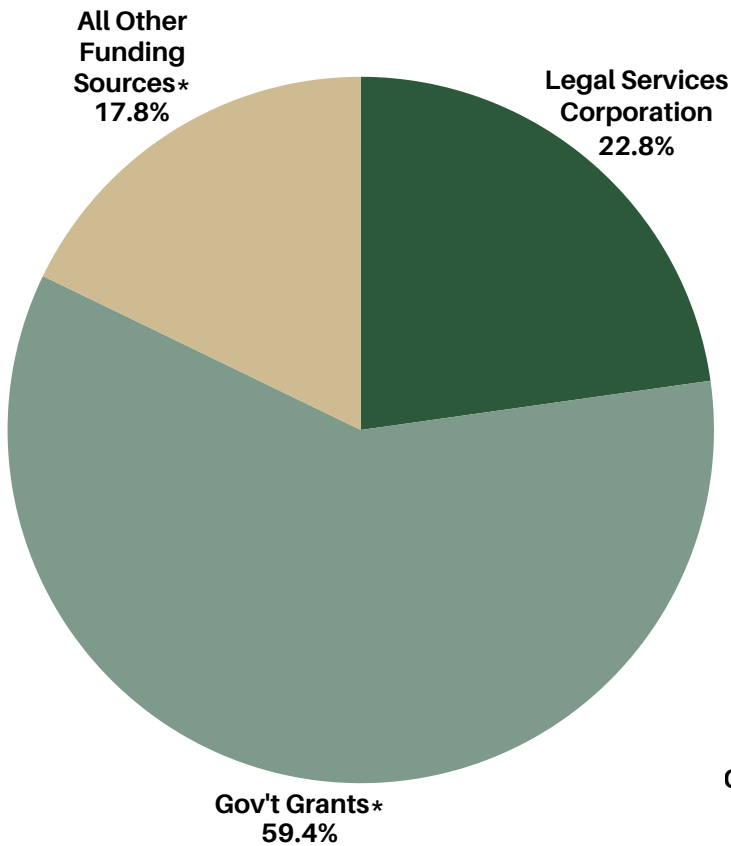

Revenue



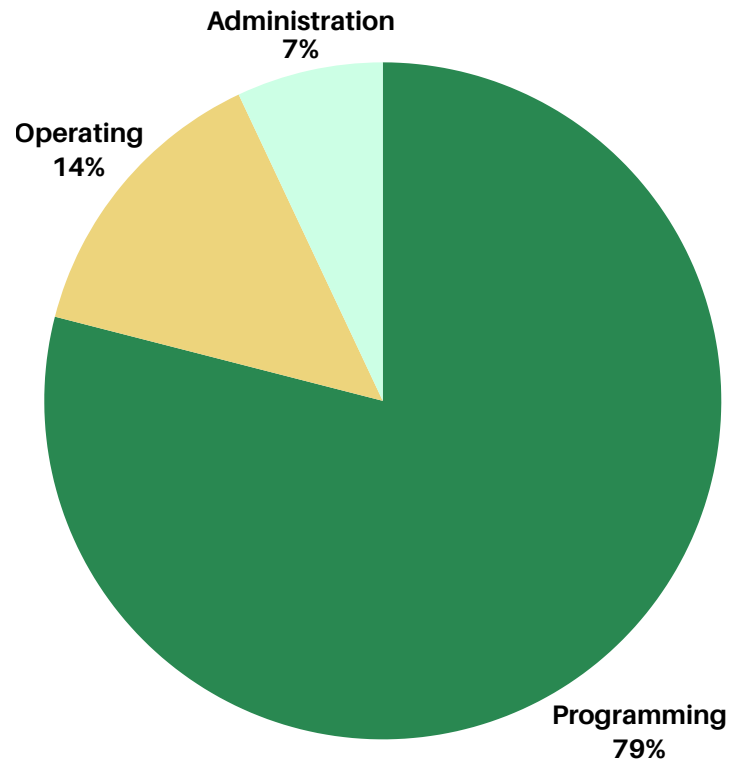

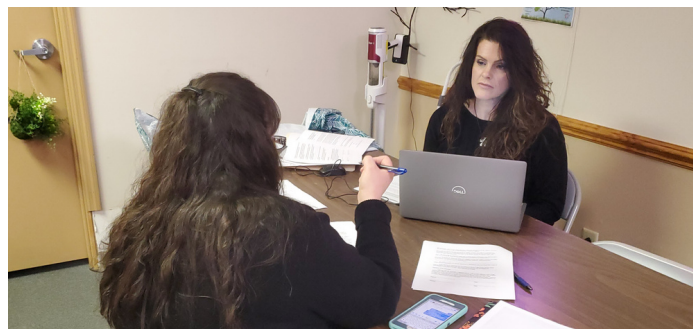

The Pro Bono Distinguished Attorney Award annually recognizes an attorney whose pro bono efforts have gone above and beyond the call of duty.



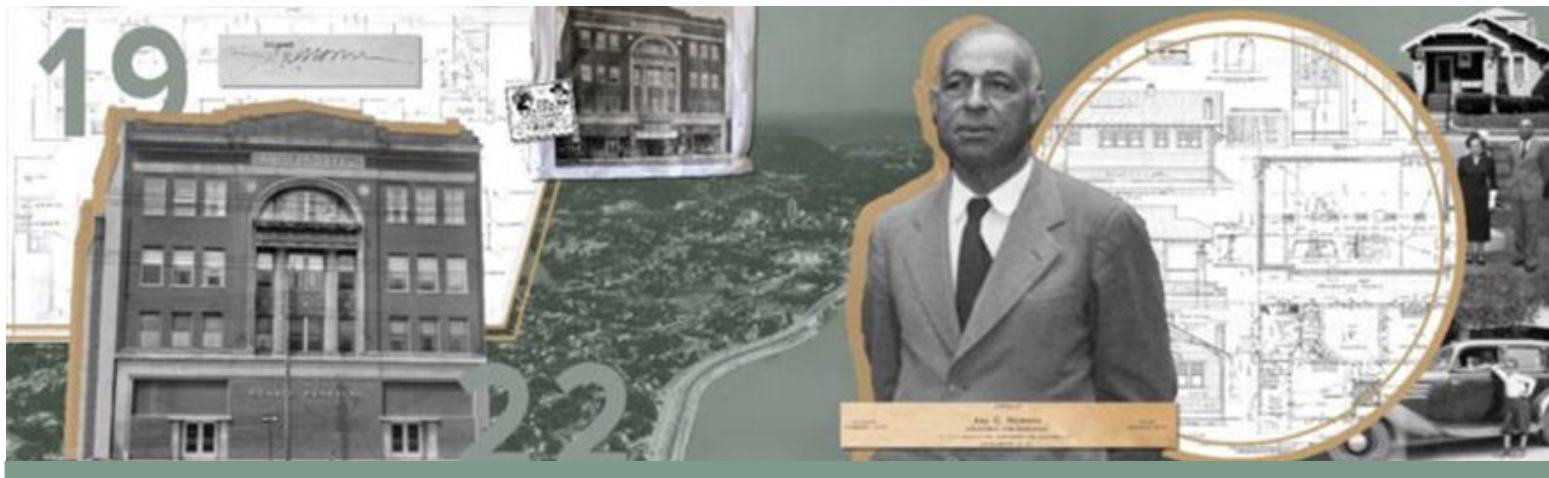

CHARLESTON

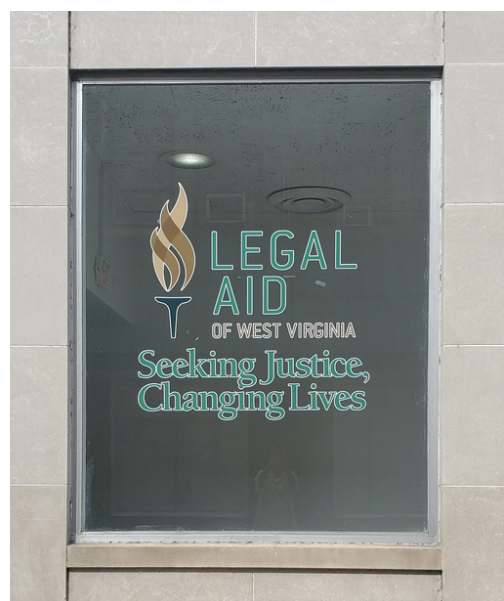

2025 Cy Pres Awards

The term Cy Pres comes from the French phrase “cy près comme possible,” meaning “as near as possible.” In legal terms, the Cy Pres doctrine allows courts to redirect unclaimed or residual funds from class action settlements to charitable causes when the original intent of the settlement cannot be fully realized.

Under the West Virginia Rules of Civil Procedure, 25% of Cy Pres distributions are designated for Legal Aid. The remaining 75% may be directed either to nonprofit organizations, schools within West Virginia, universities, colleges, or foundations that support programs that will benefit those impacted by the original intent of the case, or to Legal Aid.

Cy Pres awards directed to Legal Aid of WV help deliver vital legal services to individuals and families who cannot afford fair representation. Directing these funds to Legal Aid of WV honors the core intent of class action settlements, ensuring access to justice for those most in need. These awards have a lasting impact: they change lives, empower communities, and strengthen legal justice across our state.

Legal Aid of WV extends heartfelt appreciation to all those who champion the allocation of residual class action funds to support our civil legal mission. This advocacy helps expand access to justice and makes a lasting difference in the lives of those we serve.

Tamara's Story

Tamara is only 24 years old, but she has already taken on a tremendous responsibility—keeping her family together. Unfortunately, like many families, Tamara's immediate family suffered from substance use disorder. Tamara took over the caretaking functions of a parent for her two younger siblings, and her mother passed away seven years ago.

Tamara and her siblings moved in with their great aunt and uncle, where mental abuse was common and their basic needs for food and care were neglected. Tamara started her relationship with Legal Aid of WV's (LAWV) Lawyer in the School program shortly after that. First, she got custody of her niece, then her brother. Finally, her youngest sister joined them. Now, they are a family of five with Tamara's fiancé, excited to have been reunited and have a chance to thrive. All the children are succeeding in school and in a happy, caring home environment.

"My attorney gave me hope, which I didn't really have at the time," Tamara says. "I was really worried. My fiancé works, but a lawyer is just so expensive. It felt like a miracle that LAWV had a program like this, especially when it felt like no one could help us."

Annette's Story

Over 10 years ago, Annette had a strange run-in with her local authorities. She was driving home, and police cars with their lights on were blocking the road. It was dark and hard to see, so confusion ultimately led to an officer writing her a ticket for noncompliance with an officer and not having her driver's license with her. At the hearing for the ticket, the officer did not show up, and the charges

were dismissed. Annette didn't think about it again after that. But after she decided to go to nursing school, she was about to complete her final steps when the incident presented some trouble. The charges showed up on her background check (a part of the process to get her nursing license). "That's how I came to meet my attorney, Kira," she says. "I thought, I have to get rid of this fast. Everything she did was so fast. It was incredible. She knew the importance for me of getting that off of there so I could move forward with everything. I've been a nurse for about two years, and I work at a hospital for WVU medicine as an RN on their med surge unit. Kira saved me time and money. Being able to finish and get my license advanced my career. Since then, I've gotten married, bought a home, and I just bought a car."
